This 80km, relaxed 2-day charity ride took 45 mountain bikers on 2 circular routes through the undulating landscape in the foothills of the Outeniqua mountains. Riders were treated to unusual and

interesting water points like Kouma citrus farm, where they could taste some late season naartijes; the Brandwacht NG church where members of the congregation went all out with boerewors rolls and sweet treats: and Alta and her team from Roos Inc served, amona others, condensed milk coffee. There

was also a visit to Outeniqua Moon Perceron horse sanctuary, and a new addition to the tour this year – a gin tasting of uniquely crafted gins at Lions Creek Boutique Distillery. Participants got the chance to ride a 7km stretch of the route with five learners from Up with Downs. This gave everyone a

glimpse into the

challenges and triumphs that people with special needs and their parents face, but also showed that these individuals can still participate in events, achieve goals and have fun while doing so.

The enthusiastic welcoming party of learners was a welcome sight for tired cyclists after the slow but challenging 2 days of riding.
